



High-Level Forum on Multi-Stakeholder Partnerships and Indonesia-Africa Forum II

Bali, September 1—3, 2024

MEDIA ADVISORY

A. GENERAL INFORMATION

1. In light of the multidimensional global challenges that the world is facing today, effective international development cooperation has become more critical than ever in advancing the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. Building upon the momentum of reinvigorating the 1955 Bandung Conference that brings upon the spirit of equality to partnerships, culminating in the Right to Development, the Government of Indonesia will convene the High-Level Forum on Multi-Stakeholder Partnerships (HLF MSP) and Indonesia-Africa Forum (IAF) II, from Sunday to Tuesday, September 1-3, 2024 in Nusa Dua, Bali, Indonesia.
2. The HLF MSP initiated by the Indonesian Ministry of National Development Planning (Bappenas/PPN) will take place at the Bali International Convention Center (BICC). Under the theme of “Strengthening Multi-Stakeholder Partnerships for Development: Towards A Transformative Change”, this forum aims to facilitate dialogues, bridge collaborations, and accelerate collective action by serving as a middle ground in paving the way towards transformative changes through a multi-stakeholder approach.
3. In conjunction, the IAF II initiated by the Indonesian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, will be located at The Mulia Bali Hotel & Resort. The forum will focus on the theme of “Bandung Spirit for Africa’s Agenda 2063” and will invite high-level government officials, prominent business leaders, esteemed academicians, and other influential stakeholders to exchange ideas, establish concrete economic cooperation, and expand business networks.

B. MEDIA REGISTRATION

1. The HLF MSP and IAF II will use a single registration system. There is no separate registration to cover those events.
2. All journalists are required to register at media.msp-iaf.id in the Media Registration menu or visit the direct page at <https://media.msp-iaf.id/>. One email can only be used to register once.
3. In-person attendance and direct coverage in Indonesia will be enabled by the following mechanisms:
 - A. Official Media (OM)

OM refers to official photographers and/or videographers of the Head of State/Government or Heads of International Organizations. A list of OM must be submitted via a Note Verbale/Official Letter to the Directorate of Information and Media, MoFA Indonesia.

OM must be registered by a Data Entry Officer (DEO). Delegates are permitted to submit only 1 (one) Note Verbale for their OM registration. Please note that changes afterwards or additional submissions will not be accommodated. On the registration website, please choose Data entry Officer (DEO).
 - B. Invited Press

Invited presses are foreign and national journalists accredited and holders of the official invitation letter of the High-Level Forum on Multi-Stakeholder Partnerships and Indonesia-Africa Forum issued by the Organizing Committee.

5. Online registration is open from **August 3 to 30, 2024**. Accreditation will be granted to all those who register on the specified date.
 6. A verification email will be sent immediately to the registered email address after your registration form was successfully approved.  7. Please be informed that incomplete registration will not be processed.

C. VISA APPLICATION

1. Journalists who have received an official invitation to cover the HLF MSP and IAF II are required to apply for a journalist visa at <https://evisa.imigrasi.go.id/>.
2. Required documents as follows:
 - a. Passport valid for at least 6 (six) months (for holders of travel documents other than passports such as emergency passports, documents of identity, etc. must be valid for 12 months)
 - b. Latest color photograph.
 - c. Official assignment letter from the media institutions
 - d. Copy of media ID
 - e. Proof of return ticket
 - f. Official invitation letter from the Ministry of Communication and Informatics of the Republic of Indonesia
 - g. List of equipment (description, weight, value, country of origin)

D. CUSTOMS CLEARANCE REQUIREMENTS

1. Media representatives are encouraged to have CBP/ATA Carnets in order to expedite the customs clearance process.
2. All equipment should be shipped out of Indonesia by the end of the HLF MSP and IAF II.
